Parks in Focus: Connecting Tucson Youth to Nature through Photography Since 1999

Twenty years ago, the Udall Foundation teamed up with the Boys & Girls Clubs of Tucson (BGCT) to pilot a simple idea: put cameras in the hands of 12 middle school youth and lead them on an action-packed adventure to visit, photograph, and explore some of Arizona's most inspiring landscapes and celebrated public lands.

This idea became the Stewart L. Udall Parks in Focus® Program, an education program of the Udall Foundation committed to

engaging underserved youth with nature and our nation's public lands through photography and outdoor learning.

Flash forward to 2018: Parks in Focus hosts hundreds of hours of hands-on after-school activities, weekend outings, and summer camping trips with dozens of BGCT youth each year. Participants learn about science, history, culture, technology, and art as they hike, camp, explore, and photograph settings ranging from city parks to the Grand Canyon.
